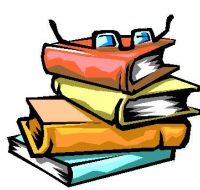

English

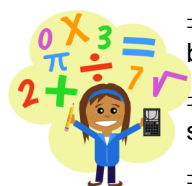


⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will continue to try their hands at planning and executing a lesson in the topic area that their class picked for cycle 6.

Math



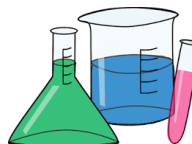
⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will estimate phi by calculating the ratios of consecutive Fibonacci numbers.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will calculate the sides of triangles using sine, cosine, and tangent.

⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will find the exact values of the trigonometric functions using the unit circle.

- ⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will use the Fundamental Theorem of Calculus to represent a particular antiderivative and the analytical and graphical analysis of functions.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will watch a science documentary on climate change then engage in class discussion.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will review acids and bases.

- ⇒ **AP/Pre-AP Physics:** Students will complete hands-on labs and review for the final exam.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will take the AP exam on Monday, May 13 at 8:00 AM and start working on presentations for their HAIS final exam.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will be taking the AP exam on Tuesday, May 14 at 12:00 PM.

⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be taking the AP exam on Thursday, May 16 at 8:00 AM.

⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are reading and analyzing primary sources from the 1960s.
