Minutes:

On Monday, January 10, the SDMC Committee met to discuss the following topics:

SIP: During January, all teachers will meet during grade-level planning to discuss the SDMC Mid-Year progress. They will recommend the SDMC regarding progress and if we need to adjust any current goals.

STAAR: In preparation for the STAAR Assessment, the administrative team will meet with all 3rd -5th-grade teachers to discuss Saturday tutorials' plans and decide which staff members are available to host the Spring Break Camp Spark. They will analyze the most recent DLA and identify targeted TEKS for the camp.

TELPAS: Because TELPAS is now a part of the school's accountability, there is a need to focus on daily intervention for all ELs. A recommendation was made to include all ancillary staff. During each rotation, all ELs will participate in language acquisition activities. The ancillary team will share their progress with all 2nd -5th-grade teachers. To address our speaking TELPAS concerns, the 2nd- 5th teacher will utilize See Saw as an instructional tool at least three times each week.

Campus Discipline: Principal Darden shared her concern regarding campus discipline and the need for all teachers to reboot their classroom procedures. For January, teachers will implement SEL best practices and work with the counselor to identify strategies to address student behavior. In addition, she will provide weekly SEL activities.

Leader In Me: A concern was shared regarding the Leader In Me process. It was brought to the attention of the SDMC committee that we need to monitor this process better. In addition, there needs to be consistency from everyone to utilize the online resources. Principal Darden will make sure all teachers have access to the online activities.

Parent workshops: To support our parents, we will offer parent workshops through the parent engagement department. During February and March, the school will offer online parent workshops to support the academic needs of our scholars.

Safety: To ensure the safety of all stakeholders, Mr. Martinez will walk the perimeter of the campus daily. He will report any concerns to the safety committee. He will submit work orders to address damaged playground equipment and replace any classroom furniture that could be considered a safety issue. Teachers will follow all safety rules outlined in our emergency handbook.
