English



 \Rightarrow **Pre-AP English I:** Students will continue reading *The Hate U Give*. Students will also work on complex inferencing using text evidence.

⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will begin their study of *Night*.

\Rightarrow AP/1302 English Language and Composition:

Students will practice their persuasive essay writing skills to prepare for the AP exam.

- ⇒ **English III:** Students will continue poetry analysis and begin reading *The Crucible*.
- ⇒ Business English: Students are now entering a semester-long projectbased learning Global Research Seminar by taking inventory of challenges around the globe and developing research questions to pursue.
- ⇒ AP/2323 English Literature and Composition: Students will practice their poetry analysis essay-writing skills to prepare for the AP exam and will begin their unit on literature from the Age of Enlightenment.
- ⇒ **English IV:** Students will be introduced to British author William Golding and the novel *Lord of the Flies*.

Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra I:** Students will learn how to simplify exponential expressions using product, power, quotient rule.

 \Rightarrow **Pre-AP Algebra II:** Students will learn how to solve and graph cubic root functions.

 \Rightarrow **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will use the discriminant of a quadratic equation to determine the number of solutions the equation has and solve quadratic equations using the quadratic formula.

- ⇒ Pre-AP Geometry: Students will define congruent figures, use the Third Angles Theorem to show triangles are congruent, and prove triangles congruent by showing that all corresponding parts are congruent.
- ⇒ Pre-AP Pre-Calculus: Students will find the area of SAS or SSS triangles.
- ⇒ AP Calculus AB: Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- \Rightarrow **AP Calculus BC:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **College Algebra:** Students will solve rational equations by clearing fractions and solve literal equations for a given variable.

Science



Pre-AP Biology: Students will learn about evolution.

 \Rightarrow **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will be investigating various types of reactions.

 \Rightarrow **Pre-AP Physics:** Students will study Newton's second law of motion with masses hanging on strings.

- ⇒ AP Biology: Students will learn about creating graphs, degrees of confidence levels, and analyzing data.
- \Rightarrow **AP Chemistry:** Students will take a test on nuclear chemistry on Monday and will learn about chemical kinetics.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will be diving deep into our Political Unit, learning how different governments work/operate and how government affects people living within the country. Vocabulary homework is due this week—please make sure your student completes their homework!

 \Rightarrow **AP World History:** Students will continue to learn about the Enlightenment and its effects.

- ⇒ Economics (HAIS): Students will be introduced to economics and begin personal finance.
- ⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students will be introduced to government and current governmental issues.

Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



 \Rightarrow **Chinese I:** Students will say and write the terms for basic personal hobbies and ask about someone's hobbies.

 \Rightarrow **Chinese II:** Students will be able to talk about the classes they are taking in Chinese.

 \Rightarrow **Chinese III:** Students will be able to compare Chinese and Western medicine.

- ⇒ Chinese IV: Students will correctly describe someone's clothing, accessories, actions, etc.
- ⇒ **AP Chinese Language and Culture:** Students will be able to speak about the advantages and disadvantages of social norms in China.
- ⇒ AP Computer Science Principles: Students will develop and write code for conditional expressions to incorporate into an existing program.
- ⇒ Introduction to Computer Science: Students will build on their coding experience as they program animations, interactive art, and games in Game Lab.
- ⇒ **Graphic Design:** Students will review class rules, expectations, and goals for the second semester.
- ⇒ PE: Students will develop positive self-management and social skills needed to work in team sports.
- ⇒ POFI 1341: Students will work on their Art in Nature Research Project and prepare for a field trip. Students will research an art element in the park and make an informational document focusing on backgrounds, color, and composition. We will go on a field trip to Hermann Park on Friday, January 17 from 7:45 AM - 12:00 PM. Parents, if you volunteer to chaperone your student will receive extra credit.
- ⇒ Political Science I: Students will discuss Machiavelli's political philosophy based on his writings in *The Prince* and compare it to current and past governmental systems.
- ⇒ Political Science II: Students will be analyzing primary resource documents and analyzing if voting rights should be mandatory in the United States.
- ⇒ Principles of Government and Public Policy (Rodriguez): Students will learn about the judicial branch through reading Article III and understand the process of the criminal justice system at the state and federal levels.
- ⇒ Principles of Government and Public Policy (J. Williams): Students will be analyzing primary resource documents and analyzing if voting rights should be mandatory in the United States.
- ⇒ **Spanish II:** Students will talk and learn about sporting events and athletes.
- ⇒ **Native Speaker Spanish:** Students will talk and learn about sporting events and athletes.
- ⇒ **Theatre Arts I:** Students will begin looking at modern theatre.
