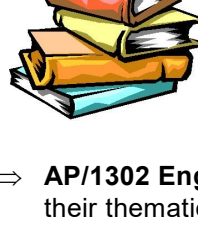
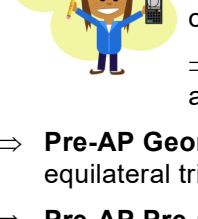


## English



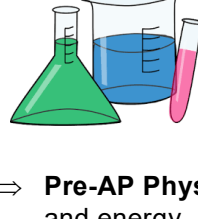
- ⇒ **Pre-AP English I:** Students will take a district exam over fiction and poetry on January 29/30. Students will also be wrapping up *The Hate U Give* and preparing for the unit project.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will finish reading *Night* while continuing to look at dystopian paired passages.
- ⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition:** Students will continue their thematic unit on Pop Culture and will prepare for their Hamilton Synthesis Essay.
- ⇒ **English III:** Students will continue studying drama and reading *The Crucible*.
- ⇒ **Business English:** Student teams will be preparing their research proposals and questions to be presented before panels on Friday, January 31. The panels will include outside STEM professionals who will evaluate their proposals and provide guidance to focus the research.
- ⇒ **AP/2323 English Literature and Composition:** Students will continue to study Enlightenment-era literature and will begin their study of satire.
- ⇒ **English IV:** Students will continue study of British literature by reading *Lord of the Flies*.

## Math



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra I:** Students will factor polynomials and take the district snapshot.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Nguyen):** Students will begin a unit on polynomials and take the district snapshot.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will transform and graph the transformation of square root functions.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry:** Students will use the attributes of isosceles and equilateral triangles to prove theorems and solve problems.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will find the limit of the polynomial.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **College Algebra:** Students will solve quadratic equations by factoring, the square root method, and completing the square.

## Science



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will learn about classification.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will be exploring and learning about thermodynamics. They will also take a test on Chemical Kinetics on Monday.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Physics:** Students will learn about momentum, impulse, work, and energy.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will get started on classification during lab and evolution during lecture.
- ⇒ **AP Chemistry:** Students will take a District Level Assessment and learn about mole and lome conversions into mass, particles, and volume.

## Social Studies



- ⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will be analyze the world's border disputes of the world to determine if we could establish better borders of compromise. Students will take a mock AP exam on Friday, February 14. Please make sure that your student is at school that day.
- ⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be analyzing the effects of the Industrial Revolution.
- ⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students will begin study of the Great Depression.
- ⇒ **Economics/Government (HAIS):** Students will work on types of government and personal finance, with a focus on the stock market.

## Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



- ⇒ **Chinese I:** Students will be able to tell others about their availability and practice their performances for the Chinese New Year Festival.
- ⇒ **Chinese IV:** Students will be able to tell others about Chinese arranged dating and practice their performances for the Chinese New Year Festival.
- ⇒ **AP Chinese Language and Culture:** Students will practice AP listening skills as well as their performances for the Chinese New Year Festival.
- ⇒ **AP Computer Science Principles:** Students will understand where data comes from, infer what could be learned or extracted from it, and be able to use computational tools to manipulate data and communicate about it.
- ⇒ **Computer Science I:** Students will apply basic Python knowledge about inputs/outputs and variables to create a game of MadLibs.
- ⇒ **Graphic Design:** Students will be introduced to vinyl design and creation.
- ⇒ **PE:** Students will demonstrate movement skills while playing team sports.
- ⇒ **POFI 1341:** Students will complete Word Chapter 6: Building documents from reusable content and using markup tools. Due Sunday, February 2 at 11:59 PM: Word Chapter 4 Sim, Word Chapter 5 Sim, Word Chapter 6 Sim, and Practice MOS Part 1
- ⇒ **Political Science I:** Students will engage in a philosophical discussion based on Thomas Hobbes' writings in Leviathan. They will begin to explore Locke's social contract theory.
