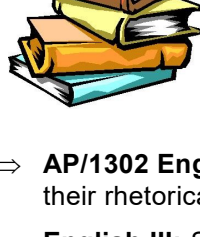


English

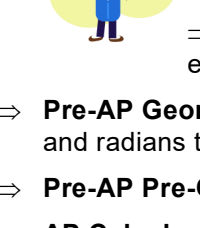


⇒ **Pre-AP English I:** Students will continue revising, editing, and rewriting expository essays in preparation for the mock STAAR.

⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will be working with poetry analysis to uncover author's style, word usage, and purpose.

- ⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition:** Students will write their rhetorical analysis essay over Lincoln's "Gettysburg Address."
- ⇒ **English III:** Students are reading a novel and analyzing poetry related to Civil Rights in the United States.
- ⇒ **AP/2323 English Literature and Composition:** Students will begin their reading and analysis of Samuel Taylor Coleridge's *The Rime of the Ancient Mariner*.
- ⇒ **English IV:** Students will finish *Lord of the Flies*, take final quizzes, and write an analytic essay.

Math



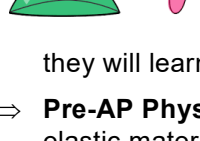
⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra I:** Students will finish their stained glass project.

⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Nguyen):** Students will finish their stained glass project.

⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will transform exponential functions.

- ⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry:** Students will convert degree measure to radians and radians to degrees.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will find the derivative of a function.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **College Algebra:** Students will solve linear equations in two variables.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will take a quiz on plant systems on Monday/Tuesday and begin animal systems on Wednesday/Thursday.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will take a test on mole concepts on Monday/Tuesday. On Wednesday/Thursday, they will learn about acids and bases.

- ⇒ **Pre-AP Physics:** Students will learn about Hooke's law and SHM of elastic materials.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about classification in bacteria and unicellular eukaryotes.
- ⇒ **AP Chemistry:** Students will be working on AP practice questions on electrochemistry and taking a quiz on Wednesday on AP Classroom.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will be dive deeper into our economic unit. We will be discussing topics dealing with industrialization and manufacturing. Students will be learning about where their clothes are made and why. We will also be debriefing the mock exam they took on February 14.

⇒ **AP World History:** Students will learn about the second wave of imperialism

- ⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students will learn about the Civil Rights movement in the United States.
- ⇒ **Economics/Government (HAIS):** Students are looking at current issues, political parties, and the economics of supply and demand.

⇒ **Chinese I:** Students will be able to share their own hobbies and explain their interest. Then they will take their chapter test.

⇒ **Chinese II:** Students will ask and answer questions about time and state when one does something at a certain time.

⇒ **Chinese III:** Students will briefly describe their symptoms; they can also understand the doctor's simple questions and answer them.

- ⇒ **Chinese IV:** Students will be able to describe the type of person they like and write their own qualifications if set up for a date.
- ⇒ **AP Chinese Language and Culture:** Students will be able to practice AP listening part three from AP Classroom.
- ⇒ **AP Computer Science Principles:** Students will research computational artifacts to develop and design their technological innovation.
- ⇒ **Computer Science I:** Students will learn the functions of casting and scripting using the Python programming software.
- ⇒ **Graphic Design:** Students will create vinyl stickers, use Illustrator, and create a Black History Twitter profile.
- ⇒ **PE:** Students will develop positive self-management and social skills needed to work in team sports.

Students have over two hours of class time to work on these assignments. Each assignment has videos and practices to walk the student step-by-step through the activities.
