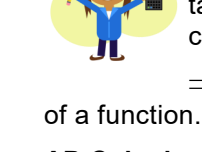


English



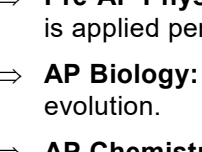
- ⇒ **Pre-AP English I:** Students will continue reading *Animal Farm*. Students will have a reading quiz.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will continue to investigate and analyze poetry.
- ⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition:** Students will practice rhetorical analysis and synthesis writing skills.
- ⇒ **English III:** Students are studying historical fiction.
- ⇒ **AP/2323 English Literature and Composition:** Students will work on poetry analysis and free response writing skills.
- ⇒ **English IV:** Students are reading *Jane Eyre*.

Math



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will learn attributes and properties of logarithmic functions.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry:** Students will use properties of tangent lines, chords, and arcs to calculate measures of central angles and lengths of segments.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will find the derivative of a function.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **College Algebra:** Students will solve and apply quadratic functions to solve real world problems.

Science



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will learn about ecological relationships and variations in them.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will read, learn, and explore about acids and bases.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Physics:** Students will learn about torque, which is a force that is applied perpendicularly from the axis of rotation.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about Kingdom Animalia and human evolution.
- ⇒ **AP Chemistry:** Students will take complete progress 3 MC on Monday. They will review and take a quiz on section 4 of FT5 on Wednesday.

Social Studies



- ⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will begin our agriculture unit. They will have vocabulary homework and a Spring Break project to go to the grocery store. I will email more details.
- ⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be reviewing essay structures, along with the rise of nationalism and communism.
- ⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are completing study of the sixties.
- ⇒ **Economics/Government (HAIS):** Students are learning about Congress and market equilibrium.

- ⇒ **Chinese I:** Students will be able to welcome a visitor and offer them a drink with good hospitality. They will also work on their family gathering project.
- ⇒ **Chinese IV:** Students will be able to share a story by using major conjunction words.
- ⇒ **AP Chinese Language and Culture:** Students will be able to analyze coronavirus articles.
- ⇒ **AP Computer Science Principles:** Students will complete and submit the Explore Performance Task.
- ⇒ **Computer Science I:** Students will use developer tools in a modern browser to explore the HTTP traffic associated with visiting common websites.
- ⇒ **Graphic Design:** Students will explore sticky stickers and their fun cut lines.
- ⇒ **PE:** Students will practice choosing different teams for different team sports.
- ⇒ **POFI 1341:** Students will take their Microsoft Certification Exams on Monday, March 9 (A Day) and Tuesday, March 10 (B Day) during class at HAIS in Room 119. Get a good night's rest, eat breakfast, and study/practice for at least two hours over the weekend by reviewing the study guide from class and making sure you know where everything is on the Ribbon. Students who do not earn certification the first time will be allowed to take the exam a second time during the next class period of the week if they attend a mandatory tutorial on Tuesday, March 10 after school.
- ⇒ **Political Science I:** Students will have one-on-one writing conferences with Ms. Rodriguez and revise their government research papers and finish their government product. Both are due on Friday, March 13.
- ⇒ **Political Science II:** Students will research and debate about citizenship questions future censuses. They will also begin participating in the Global Nomads Group Global Hunger virtual experience with students from across the globe.
- ⇒ **Practicum in Business Management:** On Monday/Tuesday, students will look at understanding benefits and 401k. On Wednesday/Thursday, students will look at emotional intelligence and mistakes that last for life.
- ⇒ **Principles of Applied Engineering:** Students have been split up into pairs and will work as teams to research the eight pathways in the engineering field.
