




⇒ AP Exams have been rescheduled for May 11-22. See the <u>full exam</u>

schedule here. Students will test at home via smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop. Exams will take approximately 45 minutes and will only include free-response items (no multiple choice). Security mechanisms will be put in place to detect cheating and plagiarism. Security violations will be reported to HAIS and universities. Your AP teacher will be able to
