Safety & Security

- IB PYP Update
 - The length and in-depth nature of candidacy application shows the commitment and how large of an endeavor this is. This is an investment!
 - Application includes profile of school, background/history of students, staff and surrounding community, explicit and thorough evidence that shows we are aligned with every standard and practice, details concerning support from the district and from feeder pattern.
 - The IB Standards will be assessed through review of Units of Inquiry, Program of Inquiry and Verification visit. It's important everything is uploaded to drive so evidence of our efforts is complete and in one place.
 - IB PYP is the primary curriculum of Patterson we use TEKS, HISD Scope & Sequence, modified 50/50 Dual Language model and UDL to meet student needs WITHIN the PYP.
 - IB application requires several teacher and student work samples, sample class schedules, IB Report Cards, etc.
- Questions, Comments and/or Concerns
 - Will money continue to be allocated to train new teachers in IB? Yes.
 - Will money be taken from elsewhere to cover training for teachers in IB? No, the money used is already specifically allocated for trainings which can be used for IB trainings, but limits funding for out-of-state conferences.
 - The biggest cost is candidacy after that it is about maintenance.
 - Are we moving forward with purchasing Imagine Learning for entire campus? Yes.
 - Is there iPad cart or access to "check out" iPads for other grade levels? Mr. Gonzalez will get with Zehra Siddiqui and see what options we have.
