<p>Campus Entrance Screening</p> <p>All students entering Kinder HSPVA campus will receive a Wellness Screen. The Wellness Screen consist of having temperature taken and answering health questions.</p> <p>Screening Questions - TRAVEL</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Have you traveled recently (in the past 14 days)?• HISD requires a 14-day quarantine following international travel only. <p>Screening Questions - TRAVEL</p>	<p>1. Temperature Screening</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• All students entering the campus will be screened with health questions and have their temperature taken. Students reporting to campus with a temperature greater than 100.0F will be escorted to the Student Health Isolation Pod (SHIP). This is a classroom that has been converted to a quarantine room, next door to the school clinic. Students presenting with symptoms of COVID-19 will remain in the SHIP until they can be picked up by their parent or guardian. If the student drives to school the ability to drive will be assessed by the school nurse. The parent or guardian must give permission for the student to drive home from campus regardless of the student's age. <p>2. Screening Questions - TRAVEL</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• If you have traveled outside of the United States to any foreign country, you will need to quarantine for 14 days prior to entering/returning to Kinder HSPVA campus. <p>3. Screening Questions - TRAVEL</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The CDC recommends taking the following actions after all travel regardless of location:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ When around others, stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people who are not from your household. It is important to do this
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Screening Questions – EXPOSURE

- Have you been exposed (in the past 14 days) to COVID-19?

Screening Questions POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST RESULTS

- Have you tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
- There are **two types of COVID-19 test** available. The diagnostic test (the nasopharyngeal swab) detects active coronavirus infection. The antibody test detects the presence of antibodies, providing an indication of past coronavirus infection. However, the antibody test does not indicate if coronavirus infection is currently present or not (FDA, 2020).

Screening Questions SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19

- Are you currently experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19?
- **COVID-19 symptoms** include but may not be limited to:
 - Fever 100.4F or greater
 - Chills

everywhere, both indoors and outdoors.

- Wear a mask to keep your nose and mouth covered when you are outside of your home.
- Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer.
- Watch your health and look for symptoms of COVID-19. Take your temperature if you feel sick (CDC, 2020).

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4. Screening Questions – EXPOSURE

- If you have been exposed in the past 14 days to COVID-19, you must self-quarantine for 14 days prior to entering/returning to Kinder HSPVA campus.

5. Screening Questions POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST RESULTS

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days (with either the diagnostic or antibody test) you must self-quarantine for 14 days prior to entering/returning to Kinder HSPVA campus.

6. Screening Questions SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19

- Students reporting to school and presenting with COVID-19 symptoms will be escorted to the Student Health Isolation Pod (SHIP). This is a classroom that has

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- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Cough
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- New onset of loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Return to School Criteria

- What are the criteria for returning to school after having COVID-19 or presenting with symptoms of COVID-19?

STEPS TAKEN TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19

been converted to a quarantine room, next door to the school clinic. Students presenting with symptoms of COVID-19 will remain in the SHIP until they can be picked up by their parent or guardian. If the student drives to school the ability to drive will be assessed by the school nurse. The parent or guardian must give permission for the student to drive home from campus regardless of the student's age.

Return to School Criteria

- Students returning to Kinder HSPVA campus after having COVID-19 or after presenting with COVID-19 symptoms must have completed a 14-day quarantine and they must be free of all symptoms of COVID-19. They must be fever free for 72 hours without taking fever reducing medication.
- Or present one of the following:
 - Documentation from a healthcare provider.
 - Received 2 negative COVID-19 test with a minimum of 24 hours between the tests.
 - Discharged from hospital with documentation to return to school. Student must not have any symptoms of COVID-19. Must be fever free for 72 hours without taking fever reducing medication.

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<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What steps are being taken on the Kinder HSPVA campus to prevent the spread of COVID-19.	<p>STEPS TAKEN TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• HISD requires all persons on its campuses and facilities to wear a mask. Face shields are optional, but masks are required.• Frequent hand washing for 20 seconds and the use of hand sanitizer when hand washing is not available.• Cough/sneeze etiquette is encouraged. Cough/sneeze into the bend of the arm at the elbow when Kleenex are not available. When coughing/sneezing into a Kleenex discard the Kleenex and wash hands immediately.• Students/staff are encouraged to stay home when sick.• Students should not share any personal items, school supplies, or food/drink. Items that must be shared should be disinfected before use by each person.• High touch surfaces will be cleaned frequently.• Desk in classrooms are spaced so that students are 6 feet apart. (ALWAYS)• Plexi-glass protective cough shields will be placed around each teacher's desk.
