Students are expected to keep a notebook including all notes and examples from class. All notes should be clearly labeled and dated. There will be a notebook check at least once per grading cycle.

Homework:

Homework assignments will count as 10% of the grade

Classwork:

Daily Assignments will count as **45%** of the grade.

Quizzes:

Each unit of study will include 1 to 2 quizzes. Quizzes are short, usually between 5 and 10 questions, and designed to assess individual concepts or skills .Quiz grades will be worth **15%** of the final grade.

Tests:

There will be a test at the end of each unit. Tests are comprehensive and designed to be challenging and test concepts and skills in multiple ways. Each test will include a short multiple choice section (4-6 questions) and a variety of free response questions. Some tests will allow the use of calculators and others will not. There will be two to three test in each grading cycle.

Tests will be worth 30% of the cycle grade.

If you are absent on the day of a test or a quiz, you must make up the test or quiz Afterschool. Schedule make-ups with your teacher as soon as you return.

Warm-up grade: Based on completion and accuracy of warm ups during the week Homework grade:
Every week you will have homework on Monday and due on Thursday.
HOMEWORK WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED LATE!

Mastery Check: Every Friday, a mastery check will be taken in which I will ask you for certain answers from the daily work and homework from the week. It will be graded on accuracy

<u>Late work:</u> Weekly assignments are due on the next day or specified due day for full credit. A student may turn in an assignment LATE up until **5 days**, which will result in 10pts off each day. After the 5th day the assignment will no longer be accepted. Homework is given every Monday and will be due every Thursday before you enter the classroom. If Homework is not turned in at that time it will not be accepted.

<u>Absences/ Make-Up Work</u>: If you are absent, **you are responsible** for getting the work you need for the day you missed. In the event of an emergency, it is your responsibility to discuss it with Mr. Del Rio. **Absolutely no late assignments will be accepted after the allotted late days.**

Tutorials: Algebra tutorials are offered. Morning and Afternoon tutorials will be at teacher discretion. Saturday tutorials will be offered.

<u>Academic Honesty:</u> It is extremely important that you do all your own work (classwork, homework, tests). If you are struggling in the class, please see Mr. Del Rio rather than make a poor decision (copy homework, cheat on a test, etc). Once you lose someone's trust, it can be difficult to earn it back. In the same vein, do NOT let anyone cheat off you or copy your homework.

<u>Tardies:</u> If you are tardy to class – you must go get a PLASCO pass. If you have a pass, place it in Mr. Del Rio hands without disrupting the class. Excessive tardies will prevent you from receiving your credits for the class – even if you are passing!

Electronics: Cell phones will be taken up at the beginning of class and will be given back to the students at the end of class.
