VIP VISITS THE BLACK KNIGHTS




CSM Daniel T. Hendrex

Command Sergeant Major Daniel T. Hendrex assumed the responsibilities as Command Sergeant Major, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command, Fort Eustis, Virginia, on Sept. 2, 2020.



The Training and Doctrine Command's senior enlisted advisor visited the Black Knights to speak with young people about the importance of public service and good citizenship. He and his staff of enlisted Soldiers told their personal stories of service going back to their high school days. Cadets asked several questions about his career, and they also asked questions about Army life. Cadet Staff Sergeant CompeanGarza, 2022 Senior, was actively pursuing a career in the U.S. Marine Corps but has changed his mission to enlisting in the U.S. Army. He credited this visit from this team to him changing his mind. Several freshmen cadets also expressed they are now interested in service as they spoke with a young Army Specialist who is in the medical field. They were inspired by her.
