Red Elementary School Goals from the 2022-23 School Improvement Plan (SIP).

Primary Grade Goals

- 1st and 2nd grade students will increase at least 5 levels based on the Benchmark Running Records.
- 1st and 2nd grade students will pass the High Frequency Word Evaluation

3rd Grade Goals:

- The percentage of 3rd grade students scoring at the Meets level on the STAAR **Reading** test will increase from 61% to at least 69% on the Reading STAAR 2023.

*The percentage of 3rd grade students scoring at the Meets level in the STAAR **Math** test will increase from 47% in Spring 2021 to 55% in Spring 2023.

4th Grade Goals:

- The percentage of 4th grade students receiving special education services scoring at the Meets level on the STAAR **Reading** test will increase from 52% to at least 57% on the Reading STAAR 2023.

5th Grade Goals:

- *The percentage of 5th grade students scoring at the Meets level in the STAAR **Science** test will increase from 31% to at least 41% on the Science STAAR 2023.

Schoolwide Goals:

- *The percentage of student attendance will increase from 92.3% to 95% for the 2022-23 school year.
