Welcome and Introductions	Ms. Solis welcomed the SDMC committee for the final meeting of the school year. A review of the reflections conducted in PLC was reviewed. Topics included Teacher Support, Curriculum and Assessment, School Climate and Culture, Physical/Emotional Safety, and PLC/PD.
Budgets Update	We have spent all our available money on material and services aligned to our SIP. We have reserved some funds to pay our newly formed Curriculum Committee which will consist of the following members: McHan, Torres, Parra, Hernandez, and Roman.
Safety Update	The recent incident in Uvalde has reminded us of how important it is to follow all established safety policies as outlined in our Faculty Handbook. We discussed how this incident can possibly impact enrollment. We agreed that the language of safety has to be highlighted in our enrollment information.
Enrollment Update	We have currently 265 students enrolled. Our projected number is 382 students for the 2022-2023 school year.
School Measures Celebration	We are happy to report that the English and the Spanish classrooms all surpassed the HISD goal of 85% and the Farias ECC goal of 90% in Letter names, letter sounds, and counting sets.
Wraparound Resource Specialist Update	Ms. Aguayo reported that her remaining funds were spent on all students to ensure that they had their FUN DAY shirt for this year's celebration. We plan to continue with Brighter Bites next school year. We have four fun days planned for Summer School.
Tentative Curriculum Support	We are looking at Frog Street 2 to support our current curriculum. We will use ESSER funds to financially support this endeavor. Our reason for moving in this direction is that we need more rigor, alignment to SEL goals, and highly engaging workstations.
Questions and Concerns	Small discussion held on the future of safety masks and gloves for the 2022-2023 school year. HISD will not longer fund PPE equipment.
