Students

- Will read for 30 minutes daily, keep a log and track reading counts points
- Will respect others and follow school/class rules
- Will keep complete daily assignments, activities, and homework in a timely manner
- Will arrive to school on time and ready to learn
- Will bring supplies and materials needed for class each day
- Will write in every content area and create two writing samples per cycle

Teachers

- Will prepare and deliver effective instruction daily to ensure students are receiving a quality education
- Will come to work on time daily
- Will share with parents and students a reading log and tips/resources based on student reading level
- Will host two virtual or face to face family nights to preview math and reading lessons and share strategies with parents
- Will send student homework and daily conduct
- Will utilize Class Dojo as the primary communication tool to keep parents informed

Park Place Goals and Focus Areas

We will focus on the following goals for the 2021-2022 school year: ELAR, Math, Discipline and Attendance.

- **Reading Goal:** The percentage of 3rd grade students performing at or above grade level in Reading STAAR as measured by the “Meets” Grade Level Standard will increase 5 percentage points from 32% in spring 2021 to 37% in spring 2022.
- **Mathematics Goal:** The percentage of 3rd-5th grade students performing at or above grade level in math STAAR as measured by the “Meets” Grade Level Standard will increase 11 percentage points from 39% in spring 2021 to 50% in spring 2022.
- **Discipline Goal:** By the end 2021-2022, the number of Level 1-2 discipline referrals sent to the front office will be maintained at 20 cases or less
- **Attendance Goal:** By the end of 2021-2022, the campus attendance will increase from 95.2% to 97%.

Parents

- Will check your child/children’s homework, conduct, and Class Dojo every day
- Remain updated on their child’s academic and behavioral performance in school
- Will provide opportunities for your child/children to read at least 30 minutes a day at home
- Will make arrangements to have your child dropped off/and pick up on time.
- Will keep the teacher informed when there is a concern that may impact the child’s academic performance
- Schedule and coordinate a minimum of five events tailored to educate parents on ways to support their child and increase family and community involvement
