I. Call to Order and Roll

II. Campus Updates

- a. Budget—Hampton: Ms. Hampton shared we are on track to exceed enrollment goals and so budget is in good standing. Currently we are reviewing how much funding we will receive with ESSER and the best ways to allocate those funds. Ms. Hampton encouraged departments to think about what they need to impact student learning and ask for it.
- b. Staffing—Hampton: Currently we have long-term sub in science vacancy. Sub has been with us on numerous occasions and does an excellent job. Other position still vacant is Campus Instructional Technologist.

III. Old Business/Unfinished Business

a. Campus Grading Policy

Ms. Hampton presented the grading policy that had been reviewed and discussed in the previous meetings. 60% major grades and 40% minor. If sub – categories are created they should be the same for the PLC. The grading policy passed.

b. Status of Auditorium: Mr. Alaniz, parent and community member asked about the status of the Auditorium repairs. The most recent timeline has repairs starting in November with completion in January 2022.

IV. New Business

a. SIP: Ms. Hampton presented the SIP to the committee. She explained that there were 14 total goals and gave the committee a summary. She also explained that the goal that HHS is focused on as a campus is that 100% of students graduate ready for college or a career as defined by TEA. The SDMC members voted to accept the SIP.

b. HB 4545

c. Students on stage for graduation: Dr. Orfield discussed the possibility of no longer having students sit on stage for graduation. She explained that at one point the purpose was to help motivate students. At this time students are so extremely driven by every single point that could impact GPA that it has gotten a bit out of control. She would like to still recognize the students at graduation who are in the top 5% but not have students sit on stage. Ms. Hampton asked the committee to get the opinions of students, parents, and other staff and the topic would be revisited next meeting.

d. Desk arrangement: Ms. Ozuna asked if teachers could once again organize their desks in groups as opposed to rows. She explained that in many instances, if a student tested positive there would be fewer close contacts if they were in groups. The committee discussed and agreed that this would not be problematic as long as teachers monitor students to make sure they are wearing masks and update their seating chart.
