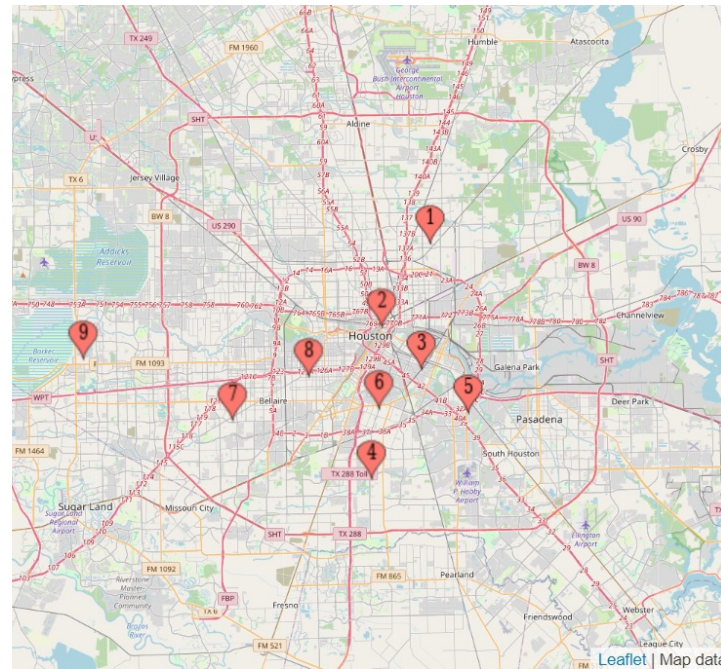

WHAT WE HEARD



Approximately 200 comments and questions were received



18% of comments were focused on academic topics like how students can access advanced academics and school choice



12.5% were focused on staff issues and included comments like teacher training and additional support for teachers



10% of comments discussed school safety

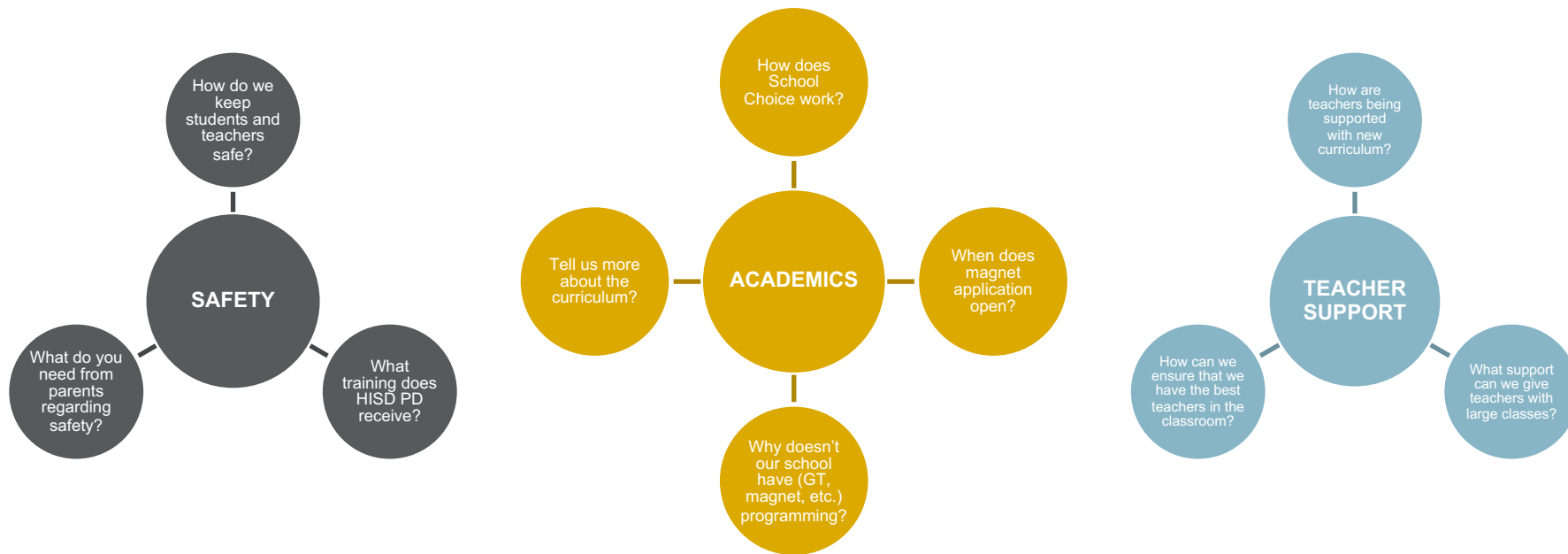


7% of the comments were focused on facilities including deferred maintenance, building upgrades and landscaping

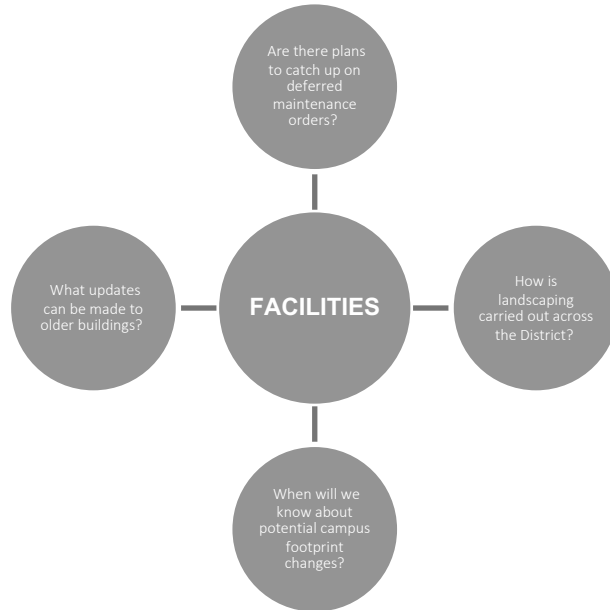


Other topics of note included: Budget, transportation, communications, SPED and community engagement
