



Askew ES SDMC Meeting Quarter 1 Meeting Notes

October 28, 2022

- Members Present - L. Grey, J. Robinson, L. Barnes, E. Cumby, D. Davison, Y. Oh, V. Pina, Bowers, N.
- School Enrollment
 - Campus is under projected enrollment and is receiving additional students each day. Askew is also the 4th HUB for the west area and is receiving capped students from Daily, Bush, Walnut Bend, and Ashford. Mrs. Cumby shared her concerns for over-crowded classrooms and said that she was working with the admin team to find ways to support teachers with behaviors and academic needs. We are currently looking at paying back about \$150,000 to the district for being under by 30 students.
- School Improvement Plan Goals
 - Mrs. Cumby presented school improvement goals for the 2022-2023 school year, which include:
 - The percentage of students in grades 3rd-5th performing at or above grade level in Reading as measured by the Meets Grade Level Standard on STAAR will increase from 53% to 68% in spring 2023.
 - The percentage of students in grades 3rd-5th performing at the Meets Grade Level Standard or above on STAAR Math will increase from 40% to 55% by Spring 2023.
 - Eighty percent (85%) of students in grades 4 and 5 will meet or exceed their STAAR progress measure by the Spring of 2023.
 - The percentage of students in grades 3-5 receiving special education services reading at or above grade level as measured by the Meets Grade Level Standard on STAAR will increase from 50% to 60% by spring 2023.
 - Mrs. Cumby shared the School Improvement Plan via Plan 4 Learning and shared that campus goals must support the larger HISD board goals. Goals were discussed, voted and approved unanimously by all members.
- 22-23 Vacancies – The campus still has the following vacancies:
 - 5th ELAR/SS
 - SpEd TA
- **Feedback/Concerns –**
 - Mr. Bowers shared a concern on behalf of the Ancillary teachers regarding students being pulled out of Ancillary or kept in class and showing up late. Mrs. Cumby said that she would address the issue with all teaching staff.
 - Mrs. Grey shared that the hallway traffic in the afternoons is becoming a big issue with students coming down 4th and 5th hallways unnecessarily and creating a bit of chaos. Mrs. Cumby acknowledged the issue, stating that in previous years there were specific traffic patterns that the school had to put in place for that reason and that she would revisit.

- Mr. Davison brought up the need for a school wide incentive for students, like bringing back the issuing of Starbucks or something similar to help with behavior management across the campus. Mrs. Grey agreed that something similar to what was used in the past would be a good idea.
