Statement of Purpose

Baylor College of Medicine Biotech Academy at Rusk is committed to the education of the children in our school community. Flexible Number of Meetings

In cases where transportation is a barrier to a parent getting involved in our school, the Administrative Team and Family Advocate make special arrangements to link that parent to necessary resources and events.

3. Baylor College of Medicine Biotech Academy at Rusk will provide parents with timely information about the programs under this part; descriptions and explanations of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the levels of proficiency students are expected to achieve. There will be opportunities for regular meetings to review, plan, and participate, as appropriate, in decisions related to their children's education as well as the school-parent-family engagement policy.
