Q3 Meeting Date: 2.27.2024

1. Safety Committee Updates - no updates to share; all drills completed to this point.
2. Nurse Update - a vision screening tool was purchased for Nurse Hall with PTO funds; the Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screener allows the nurse to read a child's visual acuity just by pointing it at their eyes. This will allow better data for parents who have children that need glass and eliminates an additional referral.
3. Review Campus Action Plan Goals - Mr. Greenberg shared middle of year (MOY) progress on the action plan goals based on the NWEA Map test.
 - a. Goal 1 MOY Goal: 75% of special education students show growth in the MAP/NWEA assessment from BOY to MOY. **Results:** 86% showed growth in Math, 51% showed growth in Science, 48% showed growth in Reading
 - b. Goal 2 MOY Goal: 70% of students in grades 2-5 will show growth on the MAP/NWEA assessment for BOY to MOY. **Results:** 87% grew in Math, 77% grew in Reading, 75% grew in Science.
 - c. Goal 3 MOY Goal: 70% of at-risk students in grades 2-5 will show growth on MAP/NWEA assessment from BOY to MOY. **Results:** 82% grew in Math.
4. HISD Campus Ratings - Mr. Greenberg shared that HISD rated Condit an 'A' based on raw STAAR data from the state and an internal calculation done by HISD; only 35 campuses earned an 'A' rating and another 58 earned a 'B' rating. Mr. Greenberg shared that nearly half the district would be NES this coming school year. As an 'A' rated campus, Condit has the autonomy to choose its own curriculum, however initial information indicates the curriculum costs will be passed on the campus. Budgets have not come out for next year, so the campus

does not know the level of funding it will receive. Right now, the campus is starting the process of a 'must have' list for curricular materials.

5. POSSIP Survey Results - Mr. Greenberg shared the results of the most recent POSSIP Survey and the committee discussed the following items:
 - a. Kindergarten curriculum - there were 3 comments about wanting to know more about the kindergarten curriculum. There was a suggestion to have a kinder report card night when the first report card comes out, to help parents understand how it is organized and how to read it.
 - b. Lunchroom - there was one comment left about lunchroom staff not being kind when correcting student behavior.
 - c. Arrival - there was one comment left about the crossing guard in the morning, allowing too many walkers to cross the street and holding up cars. A suggestion was made to let parents know that only K and PK have to use S. Third, all other parents can drop off on S. Rice, which tends to run more quickly, in part because there isn't a crosswalk and most kids are older.
6. Follow up items
 - a. Last time to bring lunch is 10am - we will begin instituting this policy next school year.
 - b. Previous POSSIP comment about too many dojo posts - parents can manage dojo through settings on their phone, but it appears that parents are getting multiple emails a day - can we check to see if that is a setting?
7. Comments, concerns, & questions - none at this time. Mr. Greenberg indicated that there may be a need for an additional meeting before May depending on any campus decisions that need to be made in response to the budget that will be released in March.
