## Agenda Items:

- Love by the Numbers: Quarter 3 Update
  - o Enrollment 337
  - Attendance 95.1%
  - MOY Testing Update Data is already posted here for viewing. This was shown to the faculty to compare BOY->MOY. The district has set more than a year's thresholds to make gains toward gaps. Tellez is confident that when EOY comes around, things will continue to rise. We tested under unusual circumstances, but we pulled through. This measure will be compared for MOY->EOY, BOY did not count. This will be a point that will be a measure of teachers' and administrators' appraisal.
  - Anderson asked how his student went from advanced high to high despite growth. Tellez explained the district's expectations to grow more than a year.
- Eagle Scout Project Approved Garden Shed and Butterfly Garden
- School Accountability Overview
  - Accountability Ratings Released by HISD The formula was released to the district for school use. These ratings are not coming from TEA directly; they are being litigated in court now. The district released this on January 23rd to distinguish which campuses will be NES. ANy campus that was not NES and rated F was automatically put in the bucket to turn NES next year. This included 2 campuses from our feeder pattern, Crockett and Browning. There were 26 schools identified but would like to add 14 additional ones to make 40 total NES campuses. Tellez said there is no doubt we could have dropped so much if we kept the same formulas. Our rating has triggered a process coming quicklywe are on a "choice" option to become NES. The district will be sending out a feedback survey to families this Wednesday. Tellez has sent his own and will share that feedback with SDMC now.
    - Kristin Hole, chief academic officer for HISD, will hold the Parent Information meeting on Thursday at 5 pm.
    - The survey is open Jan. 31-Feb. 7. Tellez will see results on Feb. 5th.
    - Feb. 7th at 12pm is the deadline for a response to the district.
    - Feb. 9th, the final NES list will be announced
    - Guyre asked if a response would be honored. The board of managers ED, and

district personnel all stated that, ultimately, the principal has the highest weight in this response. Guyre asked why was there no rubric, and they seemed not transparent.

- Tellez explained the "proficiency rating scale" for all employees. Principals need to be rated "proficient" to lead the NES campus. This comes out in late March.
- Tellez shared one question:
  - Satisfaction survey: mast survey is satisfied (94%)
  - Do you want the campus to become NES 95.1% says "No"
  - Primary Concerns: 1) Dual language program 2) Unique programming such as enrichment 3) Community culture and environment 4) Enrollment 5)
     Teacher autonomy
  - Tellez was told it was in English/Spanish; the question is, how was it received? He has questions about the accessibility.
    - Guyre asked if Tellez's personal survey could be texted, robocall?
       Guyre also asked for a survey she can give out to Love Community regardless of having a student here. Munoz will be working on this and providing it to Tellez. She stated that the community of Height Association wants to help. Maddux agreed that 2 surveys will be more impactful. Guyre is asking to add a description of what NES is in the survey. Tellez stated he would share the resources the district provided.
    - Pepper asked if this survey would be given to prospective parents.
    - Anderson asked what the common questions were.
    - Maddux asked about the impact of enrollment because of this.
       McNeill stated that school choice applications have plummeted.
       McNeill shared that only 1 application has gone through since last
       week versus last year we had over 500 applications. Intent to return
       forms were sent beforehand and are being returned slowly. Only 2
       have said "no". Tours were also affected, with a 66% decrease in
       tour assistance.
    - Maddux asked about the staffing model. February, the budget release will come out. NES has a robust staffing model, but some positions, like librarian and interventionist, still need to be there.
       Tellez stated that the primary change is in 3rd-5th. Tellez stated we may keep the same number of teachers, but they will be different position titles with NES model.
