HISD has 274 schools, 45 of which are Dual Language

HISD has the lowest property tax rate of the 20-plus school districts in Harris County.

HISD has the highest credit rating, Aaa, from Moody's rating service, and is rated AA+ by Standard and Poor's.

The Police Department currently employs 207 sworn-in officers, sergeants, commanders, and chiefs.

HISD is among the largest employers in Houston, with 27,197 full- and part-time employees.

HISD has one of the most competitive teacher compensation plans in the region, with a starting salary of \$61,500.

Nutrition Services serves 193,000+ meals each day to students at no cost.

HISD is an incredibly diverse district, with about 100 different languages spoken. 42% of HISD students are Spanish-speaking.

DEMOGRAPHICS

The Houston Independent School District, with more than 189,934 students and encompassing 333 square miles within greater Houston, is the eighth-largest public-school system in the nation and the largest in Texas. Six assistant superintendents oversee HISD elementary, middle, high and alternative/charter schools (respectively). A total of twenty-seven school-support officers report to the six assistant superintendents. These individuals provide leadership to principals, align resources and support for teachers, and ensure that the district is providing equitable and quality educational opportunities to students. Parent liaisons are available to answer questions and address matters regarding district schools.

HISD's organization is designed to emphasize teaching and learning, align school goals and programs for sustained improvement, eliminate duplicated services, and provide greater oversight of data and compliance with state laws and regulations.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness, or STAAR, is the state testing program that was implemented in the 2011-12 school year to replace the previous Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) testing program. The STAAR program includes annual assessments for:

- Reading and mathematics, grades 3–8
- Science at grades 5 and 8
- Social studies at grade 8
- End-of-course assessments for Algebra I, Biology, English I, English II, and U.S History.
