Attached is a CD with the districtwide Student Disciplinary Action Summary for the 2013–2014 academic year. This report was produced in compliance with Texas Education Code Chapter 39. It is organized according to the coding categories used by the Texas Education Agency and includes a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal disciplinary incidents that occurred on each campus. Rates were calculated by dividing the number of incidents by the PEIMS Fall Resubmission enrollment. Districtwide, the overall incident rate was 40.89, representing 86,155 incidents. The figures are decreases from the previous year's rate of 46.70 and 94,617 incidents. It must be emphasized that the numbers of incidents are duplicated counts representing the total number of incidents, not the number of students. Consequently, students may be counted more than once. This report supports HISD's Core Initiative 4: Data Driven Accountability.


The report is provided in two formats. In the first format, schools are reported according to their School Board Member Districts. The second format organizes the schools by Schools Offices. A printed copy of the Board Member District Report is provided for your convenience. Previous years' reports are available on-line on the Research and Accountability Department's website on the HISD Portal.

The following graphic and four tables present summary level data for the past three academic years for in-school suspensions (**Table 1**), out-of-school suspensions (**Table 2**), removals to the Discipline Alternative Education Program (DAEP) (**Table 3**), and expulsions to the Juvenile Justice Alternative Education (JJAEP) (**Table 4**).

- In-school suspensions decreased in 2013–2014 to 45,227, a 16.0 percent decrease over 2012–2013. This comes after a 5.7 percent increase (53,859) in in-school suspension in 2012–2013 from 50,978 in 2012–2013
- Out-of-school suspensions increased in 2013–2014 to 36,902, a .8 percent increase compared to 36,605 in 2011–2012.
- Removals to DAEP increased in 2013–2014 to 2,913, a 1.6 percent increase over the 2,868 total for 2012–2013. However, it is still a 13.5 percent decrease over the 3,369 total for 2011–2012.
- Expulsions to the JJAEP have declined steadily to 64 total expulsions to JJAEP in 2013–2014, from 78 in 2012–2013, and 87 in 2011–2012.
- Middle school students had the highest number of disciplinary actions, accounting for approximately 47 percent of the total number of actions with a rate of 104 incidents per every 100 middle school students. High school students had the second highest total number of actions accounting for approximately 40 percent of the total number of actions with a rate of 72 incidents per every 100 students.

- Violation of the *Student Code of Conduct* (disciplinary action reason code number 21) accounted for approximately 89 percent of the total number of disciplinary actions.
- Special education students, comprising eight percent of the student population, disproportionately received disciplinary actions within the district. They accounted for 12.8 percent of in-school suspensions, 16.4 percent of out-of-school suspensions, 11 percent of removals to DAEP, and 23.4 percent of expulsions to JJAEP. HISD Disciplinary Actions: 2011-2014 (Duplicated Count of Students)



Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide the number and rate of student disciplinary incidents that occurred in HISD during the 2013–2014 school year. The report was created to comply with Senate Bill 1724, as described in Section 39.053 of the Texas Education Code. Specifically, it states that the annual report must include a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, information concerning school violence prevention and violence intervention policies and procedures that the district is using to protect students, and the findings that result from evaluations conducted under the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Section 7101 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments.

The disciplinary reason codes listed in the report are presented below along with their definitions. The data were obtained from summer 2013–2014 PEIMS summer resubmission file submitted to the Texas Education Agency. The rate was calculated by dividing the number of incidents that occurred by the fall enrollment during 2012–2013 school year.

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide the number and rate of student disciplinary incidents that occurred in HISD during the 2013–2014 school year. The report was created to comply with Senate Bill 1724, as described in Section 39.053 of the Texas Education Code. Specifically, it states that the annual report must include a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, information concerning school violence prevention and violence intervention policies and procedures that the district is using to protect students, and the findings that result from evaluations conducted under the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Section 7101 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments.

The disciplinary reason codes listed in the report are presented below along with their definitions. The data were obtained from summer 2013–2014 PEIMS summer resubmission file submitted to the Texas Education Agency. The rate was calculated by dividing the number of incidents that occurred by the fall enrollment during 2012–2013 school year.
