Attached is a CD with the districtwide Student Disciplinary Action Summary for the 2009–2010 academic year. This report was produced in compliance with Texas Education Code Chapter 39. It is organized according to the coding categories used by the Texas Education Agency and includes a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal disciplinary incidents that occurred on each campus. Rates were calculated by dividing the number of incidents by the PEIMS Fall Resubmission enrollment. Districtwide, the overall incident rate was 50.33, representing 101,135 incidents. The figures are increases from the previous year's rate of 50.26 and 100,278 incidents. It must be emphasized that the numbers of incidents are duplicated counts representing the total number of incidents, not the number of students. Consequently, students may be counted more than once. This report supports HISD's Core Initiative 4: Data Driven Accountability.

The report is provided in two formats. In the first format, schools are reported according to their School Board Member Districts. The second format organizes the schools by Chief School Officer. A printed copy of the Board Member District Report is provided for your convenience. Previous years' reports are available on-line on the Research and Accountability Department's website on the HISD Portal.

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide the number and rate of student disciplinary incidents that occurred in HISD during the 2009–2010 school year. The report was created to comply with Senate Bill 1724, as described in Section 39.053 of the Texas Education Code. Specifically, it states that the annual report must include a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, information concerning school violence prevention and violence intervention policies and procedures that the district is using to protect students, and the findings that result from evaluations conducted under the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Section 7101 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments.

The disciplinary reason codes listed in the report are presented below along with their definitions. The data were obtained from summer 2009–2010 PEIMS summer resubmission file submitted to the Texas Education Agency. The rate was calculated by dividing the number of incidents that occurred by the fall enrollment during 2009–2010 school year.

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide the number and rate of student disciplinary incidents that occurred in HISD during the 2009–2010 school year. The report was created to comply with Senate Bill 1724, as described in Section 39.053 of the Texas Education Code. Specifically, it states that the annual report must include a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, information concerning school violence prevention and violence intervention policies and procedures that the district is using to protect students, and the findings that result from evaluations conducted under the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Section 7101 et seq.) and its subsequent amendments.

The disciplinary reason codes listed in the report are presented below along with their definitions. The data were obtained from summer 2009–2010 PEIMS summer resubmission file submitted to the Texas Education Agency. The rate was calculated by dividing the number of incidents that occurred by the fall enrollment during 2009–2010 school year.
