and 2013 GRADUATE PERFORMANCE IN HIGHER EDUCATION

In an effort to track and obtain more information about our students after they graduate, the Houston Independent School District (HISD) utilizes the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) data. The THECB provides information to districts on student enrollment and performance in Texas postsecondary institutions from their first year enrolled after high school graduation. Performance is measured by the Grade Point Average (GPA) for those students who attend Texas public four-year and two year institutions. This report supplements the National Student Clearinghouse report that was produced on September 20, 2014.

THECB reported 45.0% of HISD's 2012 graduates and 44.0% of 2013 graduates attended a Texas postsecondary institution in the fall following graduation. **Table 1** includes enrollment of the district's 2012 and 2013 graduates. The data was extracted from THECB's report of high school graduates postsecondary enrollment in the fall semester following graduation. Student enrollment by campus is included in **Attachment A**.

Table 2 contains the academic performance for the Class of 2012. Student performance is measured by the GPA earned by the end of the 2012-2013 academic year. Performance data for the Class of 2013 is not currently available. It should be noted that the data in **Table 2** was extracted from THECB's report of 2012 graduates' GPAs for the first year of postsecondary enrollment in Texas. The data is a reflection of the entire academic year including fall 2012, spring 2013, and summer 2013. Therefore the enrollment and level of institution may not match the 2012 enrollment data from **Table 1** which includes enrollment based on the fall 2012 semester only.

For 2012 graduates who attended two-year public colleges, 39.2% earned a GPA of 2.5 or greater by the end of the academic year. For 2012 graduates who attended a four-year university, 49.1%

earned a GPA of 2.5 or greater by the end of the year. See **Attachment B** for full explanation of THECB's data. **Attachment C** includes performance data by campus from the THECB report for HISD. Only campuses with 25 or more graduates are included.




Students attending Texas public institutions of higher education must be in compliance with the Texas Success Initiative (TSI), as of fall 2003 (Texas Education Code §51.3062) in order to enroll in public institutions of higher education. The law requires all entering college students to be assessed for college readiness in reading, mathematics and writing unless the student qualifies for an exemption. Each student who fails to meet the minimum passing standard of the exam offered by the institution must be placed in a developmental education program designed to help the student achieve college readiness.

Figure 1 provides the 5-year trend of TSI performance of HISD graduates from 2009 thru 2013 and includes those who met TSI standards via (1) an approved test for TSI exemption SAT, ACT, TAKS, (2) an approved test for TSI purposes (THEA, COMPASS, ASSET, or ACCUPLACER), and/or (3) other allowable means. **Attachment D** includes additional information about the TSI report from the THECB.

Since 2009, the percentage of HISD graduates that met TSI standards in all three areas (math, writing, and reading) has steadily increased each year from 64% in 2009 to 69% in 2013. Additionally, there has also been percentage increases in each of the individual sections with writing and reading having the highest percentage of students that met the TSI standards.



The THECB reported 2,069 HISD 2012 graduates and 138,308 graduates across the state enrolled in a public college/university in Texas in 2012-2013. **Figure 2** compares the percent of 2012 graduates from HISD to graduates statewide and includes 1) the percentage of graduates who enrolled in developmental education but did not successfully complete their first college-level course in the subject area, 2) the percentage of graduates who successfully completed their first college-level course without enrolling in any developmental courses, and 3) the percentage of graduates who successfully completed their first college-level course while enrolled in at least one developmental course.



Note Subject specific College-Level courses include: Reading: ENGL 1301, 1302, GEOG 1300, Literature courses, Art history, music history, and theater history courses: Writing: ENGL 1301, literature and history courses; Math: All 1000-level and 2000-level ACGM MATH or lower-level university credit-bearing math

<u>Math</u>- Thirty-one percent of students who graduated from HISD, and who were enrolled in any developmental course, did not successfully complete a college-level math course within their first year of enrollment. This is 5.6% higher than the statewide percentage. For students that were not enrolled in any developmental course, 36.1% of HISD graduates completed their first college-level math courses, a little less than the state's percentage of 39.2%. However, the percentage of students that completed their first college-level math course while simultaneously enrolled in at least one developmental course was higher for students who graduated from HISD 6.6%, compared to the state's percentage 4.0%.

Reading- For students who graduated from HISD, and who were enrolled in any developmental course, 6.9% did not successfully complete a college-level reading course within the first year of enrollment which was 1.5% lower than the statewide percentage. Sixty-six percent of HISD graduates, who were not enrolled in any developmental course, completed their first college level reading course compared to the state's percentage of 65.3%.

<u>Writing</u>- Eleven percent of students who graduated from HISD, who were enrolled in any developmental course, did not successfully complete a college-level writing course within the first year of enrollment compared to the statewide percentage of 9.2%. However, more HISD graduates (59.2%), who were not enrolled in any developmental course successfully completed their first college-level writing course which was slightly higher than the state's percentage of 57.5%.




Figure 3- HISD 2012 Graduates enrolled in College in 2012-2013, Math and English Course Outcomes

Figure 3 reveals how HISD 2012 graduates performed in Math 1314/1414 (College Algebra) and English 1301(English Composition) during their first year of postsecondary enrollment compared to students statewide. Successful completion is determined by a receiving grade of C or better.

In the 2012-2013 academic year, 1,293 HISD 2012 graduates and 36,176 graduates statewide enrolled in Math 1314/1414. The percentage of HISD graduates that successfully completed the course slightly trailed that of students statewide by 1.6 percentage points. However, 12.9% of students statewide withdrew from the course compared to 10.4% of HISD graduates.

For English 1301, there was relatively no difference in the percentage of HISD 2012 graduates that successfully completed the course, 71.5%, and the percentage of graduates statewide, that successfully completed the course, 71.6%. However, the percentage of HISD graduates that withdrew was 2.7% lower than the state's percentage.

For both Math 1314/1414 and English 1301, the percentage of 2012 graduates that did not successfully complete the course, that is, they received a grade of "D" or "F", was larger for HISD graduates compared to graduates statewide.

The course outcomes of Math 1314/1414 and English 1301 of HISD 2012 graduates, by campus, can be found in **Attachment E.**

Attachment B

Report of 2011-2012 High School Graduates' Enrollment and Academic Performance in Texas Public Higher Education in FY 2013

(Extracted from THECB Report)

Texas statute requires every school district to include, with their performance report, information received under Texas Education Code §51.403(e). This information, provided to districts from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), reports on student performance in postsecondary institutions during the first year enrolled after graduation from high school.

Student performance is measured by the Grade Point Average (GPA) earned by 2011- 2012 high school graduates who attended public four-year and two-year higher education in FY 2013. The data is presented alphabetically for each county, school district and high school. The bookmarks can be used to select the first letter of a county. Then the user can scroll down to the desired county, school district and high school.

For each student, the grade points and college-level semester credit hours earned by a student in fall 2012, spring 2013, and summer 2013 are added together and averaged to determine the GPA. These GPAs are accumulated in a range of five categories from < 2.0 to > 3.5. If a GPA could not be calculated for some reason, that student is placed in the "Unknown" column. GPA data is only available for students attending public higher education institutions in Texas. If a high school has fewer than five students attending four-year or two-year public higher education institutions, the number of students is shown but no GPA breakout is given. If a student attended both a four-year and a two-year institution in FY 2013, the student's GPA is shown in the type of institution where the most semester credit hours were earned.

The number of students located at Texas independent institutions is presented. Also shown are "not trackable" graduates, those with non-standard ID numbers that cannot be used to match student identifiers at Texas higher education institutions. "Not found" graduates have standard ID numbers but were not located in FY 2013 at Texas higher education institutions. They might have enrolled in higher education outside of Texas.

No data is given for high schools with 25 or fewer graduates.

Because the statute calls for data on the first year enrolled after graduation, the level of the institution attended by students in this report may not match that given in THECB's high school to college report at http://www.txhighereddata.org/Interactive/HSCollLink. That report shows where students attended in the fall semester after their high school graduation year. This report attributes students to the level of institution where they earned the most semester credit hours during the whole academic year, not just the fall semester.

Please note: In May 2012 the 2006-2007, 2007-2008, and 2008-2009 versions of the Report of High School Graduates' Enrollment and Academic Performance in Texas Public Higher Education were updated to reflect a minor correction in how the GPA data are distributed across ranges.

Report of Student Performance on Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Readiness Measures 2012-2013 High School Graduates Enrolled in Texas Public Higher Education in Fall 2013 (Extracted from THECB Report)

As mandated by state statute, the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) includes standards for minimum test scores or performance in the areas of mathematics, writing, and reading that indicate students' readiness to enroll in freshman-level academic college coursework. Public higher education institutions must have a developmental education plan for students who do not meet testing requirements.

Every semester, Texas public higher education institutions report information to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) about their students' TSI status, developmental coursework attempted, and performance in first math, reading-related and writing-related college-level courses. The data collected is used to produce this report about the TSI status of recent high school graduates who enroll in Texas public higher education and a number of other reports.

A new TSI reporting process was implemented in spring 2009. As a result, the methodology for the 2008 TSI high school report was transitional and several years of comparison data were provided. The 2009 TSI high school report was the first which presented information about student readiness using data that was submitted on the redesigned TSI report. Beginning with 2009, the high school graduate report tracks student readiness at the time of enrollment in higher education. The 2008 report and comparison years tracked students' preparedness through the end of their first fall semester; earlier reports tracked students through their entire first academic year. For this reason, comparisons should not be made with the data in the annual TSI high school reports prior to 2009.

The decision to present student readiness data at the time of enrollment was made for several reasons:

The recent introduction of *Graduates' Enrollment and Academic Performance in Texas Public Higher Education* can give school districts insight into how their students perform once enrolled in college by providing student grade point ranges.

Many school districts have expressed interest in learning how prepared their students are when they arrive at college to better gauge how well their K-12 system prepares students.

College readiness at the time of enrollment is baseline data that is used in the state higher education accountability system when tracking student cohorts on TSI measures. The methodology for determining readiness on this high school report now aligns with the methodology used for TSI reporting on higher education institutions. However, the cohorts are determined in a slightly different manner.
