SUBJECT: **DECEMBER 2018 STAAR END-OF-COURSE PERFORMANCE**

The Houston Independent School District (HISD) has received the results for the December 2018 administration of the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness End-of-Course (STAAR EOC) exams. These exams are a graduation requirement and were given to eligible students who did not meet the satisfactory level of performance in previous administrations (retesters), as well as students who completed a course and tested for the first time.

Under House Bill 5 (HB 5), passed by the 83rd Texas Legislature and signed by the governor, high school students are required to pass five STAAR EOC assessments to meet the graduation requirements. These five assessments include Algebra I, English I (combined reading/writing), English II (combined reading/writing), Biology, and U.S. History.

Key findings include:

- The percent of All Students (includes both first-time and retested students) performing at or above the Approaches Grade Level standard ranged from 16 percent (English I and English II) to 38 percent (U.S. History). (Table 1)
- Most of the students who tested in December were English I or English II "re-testers."
 (Figure 1)
- For all subjects, the percentage of students performing at or above the Approaches Grade Level Standard has increased when compared to the December 2017 results. (**Table 2**)
- Of the 18,189 STAAR EOC tests administered in December 2018, 12 percent (2,264) were taken by ninth-grade students, 36 percent (6,512 tests) were taken by tenth-grade students, 31 percent (5,657 tests) were taken by eleventh-grade students, and 21 percent (3,747 tests) were taken by twelfth-grade students. **(Table 4)**

Administrative Responses to the December 2018 STAAR EOC results:

The Secondary Curriculum and Development department continues to revise and develop curriculum resources and provides teacher coaching to support high-quality instruction. In addition to prioritizing the development of review resources based on Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), the department also works alongside the Office of Special Populations to ensure that data-driven best practices for interventions are in place at all secondary schools. Additionally, staff development has been provided in the utilization of district digital resources for targeted areas of student need.

The Multilingual Department in collaboration with the Elementary and Secondary Curriculum Departments developed training to ensure campus personnel were given strategies to effectively shelter instruction for English Learners (ELs). We offered numerous opportunities for campus personnel and district Teacher Development Specialists to partake in HISD Literacy Routines Sheltered Instruction 2-day Institute with follow up training offered during early dismissal days. In addition to this, the Program Specialists supported campuses by offering

personalized trainings for the campuses as needed, as well as coaching and support of implementation of the strategies in classrooms.

As EOC results were posted, the Multilingual (ML) Department has initiated the following supports for campuses to address the needs of all ELs.

- HISD Literacy Routines Sheltered Instruction 2-day Institute will be offered again to provide all campus personnel and district instructional coaching leaders another opportunity to participate in training to ensure that teachers and instructional coaching teams have access to the strategies necessary to improve EL outcomes.
- ML Managers and Program Specialists are reviewing Language Proficiency Assessment Committee (LPAC) Designated Support Decisions with campuses to ensure students were given the appropriate designated supports. In doing so, ML teams will assist in making recommendations based on current data to ensure students receive the supports that will yield the most gains.
- ML Program Specialists will continue to work with campus personnel to ensure that Literacy Routines are used with fidelity, and support teachers to use designated supports routinely during instruction and when assessing students.

Interventions Teacher Development Specialists (TDS) will continue to work with strategic Reading and Writing teachers and other teachers assigned to re-testers. Their work includes: assisting with data disaggregation, assisting with planning small group instruction to address heavily tested content, and scaffolds to support students struggling to access grade level curriculum. Intervention Assistance Team (IAT) Managers will continue to provide training and support around the use of designated supports that students can use both during classroom instruction and while taking assessments. These supports are designed to assist students that have documented evidence of reading and/or math difficulties. The Interventions Office launched the Read to Achieve curriculum in the fall of 2018. This program is designed especially for secondary students who exhibit reading difficulties. The intervention TDS as well as Managers consistently provide coaching and feedback to campuses around the use of this curriculum designed to strengthen literacy.


