The Houston Independent School District (HISD) has received the results for the June 2019 administration of the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness End-of-Course (STAAR EOC) exams. These exams are a graduation requirement and were given to eligible students who did not meet the satisfactory level of performance in previous administrations (retesters), as well as students who completed a summer school course and tested for the first time.

Under House Bill 5 (HB 5), passed by the 83rd Texas Legislature and signed by the governor, high school students are required to pass five STAAR EOC assessments to meet the graduation requirements. These five assessments include Algebra I, English I (combined reading/writing), English II (combined reading/writing), Biology, and U.S. History.

Key Findings:

- Of the 9,921 STAAR EOC tests administered in June 2019, 47 percent (4,650 tests) were taken by ninth-grade students, 30 percent (3,008 tests) were taken by tenth-grade students, 16 percent (1,597 tests) were taken by eleventh-grade students, and 6 percent (632 tests) were taken by twelfth-grade students.
- Of the 4,650 STAAR EOC tests taken by ninth-grade students, 2,082 (45 percent) were taken in English I and 1,329 (29 percent) were taken in Algebra I.
- Students performing at or above the Approaches Grade Level Standard ranged from 15 percent on English I to 35 percent on Algebra I.
- When compared to last year's results, the percentage of students at or above the Approaches Grade Level Standard increased in Algebra I (5 percentage points), decreased in Biology (2 percentage points), English I (5 percentage points), and U.S. History (6 percentage points), and stayed the same in English II.
- There was a 17 percent decrease in the total number of testers (from 11,960 to 9,921) from June 2018. There was a 12 percent decrease in the total number of testers in Algebra I, 13 percent in English II, 16 percent in Biology, 19 percent in U.S. History, and 23 percent in English I. This is reflective of improved performance on the Spring 2019 assessments.

Administrative Responses to the June 2019 STAAR EOC results:

Secondary Curriculum and Development

The Secondary Curriculum and Development core content teams are utilizing the data from June 2019 STAAR EOC Performance to inform strategies for retesting students:

- Curriculum Units/Master Course Lessons and digital resources that provide opportunities for personalized instruction based on individual student needs;
- Support instruction that favors the application of concepts;

- Teacher Development Specialists (TDS) for each of the four content areas to support
 campuses with developing instructional plans for retesters that addresses the specificity of
 each content area, instructional coaching, co-teaching, modeling review lessons included in
 master courses, and collaborating with district/non-district stakeholders to address the
 needs of retesters;
- Lead4ward training for Teacher Development Specialist, teachers, and campus leaders to focus on targeted and strategies and skills geared toward the notion of review and retesting;
- A focus on Literacy Empowered best practices and trainings to ensure all students have opportunities to engage in reading, writing, speaking, listening, and thinking in every class, every day;
- Analysis of Universal Screener data to understand students' literacy needs and to plan instruction that supports content understanding, literacy growth, and language acquisition;
- Integration of sheltered instruction strategies within all core-content areas; and
- District-wide awareness and understanding of appropriate supplemental aid resources as appropriate for each content area.

Schools Offices

- Support was provided to the Tier III and II Achieve 180 campuses in the form of reading specialists who provided support through:
 - Coaching
 - Modeling best practices
- Data Driven Instructional Specialists provided support with a focus on students' needs, individual gaps, and setting target goals.
- Direct support was provided by Teacher Development Specialists (TDS), by providing resources, coaching teachers, analyzing student data with campus leaders.
- Highly effective teachers were recruited and identified by campus leaders to provide intensive interventions to bolster student growth.
- Ongoing progress monitoring and data analysis was supported through:
 - Data Driven Instructional Specialists supporting Tier I, II, and III campus leaders.
 - Student Assessment providing data tools to help identify areas of focus.
 - School Support Officers providing professional development opportunities on data disaggregation and action planning.
 - Before and after school interventions offered at various campuses.
 - Strategic online resources offered to provide individualized interventions.
- Each high school campus utilized their respective assessment plan based on campus instructional needs.

Multilingual Programs Department

Throughout the school year, the Multilingual department offered campus administrative teams support with bilingual and ESL programming implementation to ensure students were supported based on language proficiency needs. In addition to programming support, the department collaborated with Curriculum and Instruction to develop professional development for central office staff and campus teams on Literacy Routines (sheltered instruction). The Multilingual department continued campus support throughout the month of May, and specialists followed up with end-of-year face-to-face and desk audits. Specialists provided support with reviewing end-of-year STAAR data to make instructional decisions for summer programs and beginning-of-year supports for English Learners (ELs) based on language proficiency and STAAR performance.

Special Populations Office

The Office of Special Education Services:

During the 2019–2020 school year, the Office of Special Education Services (OSES) will add the following support:

- Monthly trainings for new and veteran school leaders and general and special education teachers:
 - Monthly department chair meetings
 - New department chair cohort
 - Teach SpEd U to support new special education teachers
- Deep Dive into the ARD-IEP Process for campus administrators to effectively monitor instruction for specially designed data analysis protocols using data that focuses on students with disabilities;
- Site and support visits by program specialist and senior managers;
- Training for school leaders that include tools for integrating support for students with disabilities during Tier I instruction;
- Training on Unpacking the IEP for special education teachers;
- Training on aligning the PLAAPF and IEP goals to the FIE;
- C-Cubed monthly training for OSES program specialists and SPED leaders to support instructional coaching;
- Increase campus-based training to support:
 - Data-driven instruction
 - Curriculum documents
 - Progress Monitoring;
- Increase campus-based modeling of Specially Designed Instruction (SDI);
- Incorporate supplemental materials to support students in reading and math;
- Model Professional Learning Communities (PLC) between special education and general education teachers on Inclusive Practices; and
- Continuation of a robust offering of professional development for leaders, special education, and general education teachers.


