The general purpose of this meeting was to brief the Oversight Committee members on the current status of the new construction and renovation projects funded through the 2007 Facilities Capital Program and to discuss related issues, questions, and activities:

Introduction

 Mr. Issa Dadoush called the meeting to order @ 8:35 a.m. After the welcome, he allowed round table introductions of each attendee. He conveyed to the committee that he would provide an executive summary of the status of construction projects over the past year.

2. Meeting Minutes from October 19, 2011:

A draft of the previous meeting minutes was reviewed. Mr. Chris Hudson, Chair noted corrections should be made to Item 4 and Item 5. A motion was made to approve minutes with corrections to Item 4 and Item 5.

3. Executive Summary

Mr. Dadoush presented an Executive Summary, outlining the transformation of schools throughout the city due to the \$805 million bond proposal that voters

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approved in 2007. The summary included expansions, safety and security upgrades, and new schools to replace aging facilities and relieve crowding.

4. Financial Report

The Financial Report was presented next. Ms. Kathi Redrick discussed the current overall financial status report for the 2007 Facilities Capital Program. The total funding is comprised of \$1,176,130,677, actual committed to new construction/renovation is \$733,023,026 (62%) and the program reserve available funding is \$433,107,651 (37%).

Ms. Tonya Savoie presented the schedule of projects, commitments, budget reports and detailed contingency reports. She also commented closeout leftover funds will be returned to program reserves. Mr. Bobadilla and Mr. Dadoush reiterated that the project closeout period has been shortened which includes a 60-day solution.

Substantial Completion

Mr. Gary White requested a definition of substantial completion. Mr. Bankhead responded that substantial completion refers to the building reaching a point that it is ready for occupancy for its intended purpose.

Progress Update Report

Next, Construction and Facility Services presented an update on the status of projects in the Facilities Capital Program. Mr. Bankhead provided a summary of the Traffic Light Report. The summary included 5 new campuses (DeAnda Elementary School, Peck Elementary School, Cunningham Elementary School, Roosevelt Elementary School and Allen/Kennedy Elementary School) that were opened this school year, as well as 22 renovation projects completed. The report reflects the construction and renovation phase and progress of each project. Currently there are 28 projects in the planning phase; 22 projects in the bidding phase; 69 projects in the construction phase; 35 projects in the warranty phase and 20 projects that are 90 % to 97% complete.

LEED Certification

Mr. Bobadilla informed the committee that CFS has designed one-page LEED reports for several construction projects. Strategies have been implemented to ensure construction projects meet standards of LEED Certification. Two schools received Silver Certification from the USGC and efforts have been initiated to move toward additional projects seeking Gold, Platinum or Silver.

Additional Comments

Mr. Gary White requested the status of Phase B-Group 4 schools. Mr. Dadoush reported that the permitting delay process has been improved. Design teams are completed in a timely manner. CFS and the City of Houston have strengthened their relationships. As a result, the City of Houston is accommodating HISD projects.

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Mr. Tran requested an explanation of Capital Funding. Capital funds in the amount of \$13.5 million dollars were allocated to each trustee, totaling \$121 million dollars overall. These funds can be used at a school in the trustees' area, portions of the 2007 Bond Referendum, Projects Funding must be Board approved for projects and all funds for projects are Board approved.

Ms. Doyle requested information regarding plans for the next bond, a 10-year master plan for new schools and site visits to new schools. Technology is a large component in the future of education and integrated in the classroom on a one-to-one ratio. Mr. Bankhead reported a facilities master plan will be developed; needs identified; plans developed; roles and needs of CS/CFS identified; consultation with policymakers and discussions will be held with the Board.

Mr. Gary White expressed concerns of accountability. Mr. Bobadilla, Mr. Dadoush and Mr. Bankhead concurred that all stakeholders internally and externally are good stewards of the construction projects. Mr. Bobadilla reported to the committee that press releases and videos of schools would be shared. In an effort to communicate what is happening with the construction projects Mr. Bankhead and Mr. Dadoush will meet with community organizations and associations.

6. Business Assistance (M/WBE) Report

Ms. Licata discussed how to do business with HISD, events and outreach programs that have taken place since the October 2011 committee meeting. The M/WBE participation regarding A/E projects are up 3%. Charts were included in the presentation to reflect M/WBE participation for CSP Contractors Projects, CMAR projects, CMPA Projects and the Total Combined Projects. Monthly tracking reports to ensure licensures are renewed every two years with the City of Houston.

Mr. Bobadilla commented on payment/non-payment concerns for general contractors and sub-contractors. First tier general contractors are paying 100%, but second tier general contractors are being re-evaluated to ensure payments are made in a timely manner. Ms. Licata reported that it has been communicated throughout the community, payment disputes will be handled by the appropriate department. Mr. Dadoush reiterated, first, second and third tier payments would be addressed.

Business Assistance/ Finance

7. Supplemental Program Information

Mr. Dadoush reported funding in access of \$5 million dollars, were identified from the school closings of Rhodes Elementary School and Grimes Elementary School. Funding from these reserves was reallocated, resulting in board items approved for various schools to facilitate improvements.



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8. Recent Press Releases

Mr. Issa presented press releases that included HISD delivering promises made during 2007 construction campaign; President Obama recognizes HISD's commitment to saving energy and New Year to bring more new campuses for HISD students.

Ms. Doye suggested press releases continuously be added. Mr. Bankhead and Mr. Bobadilla reported news articles are on the districts' website, including an online project schedule.

9. Executive Session:

Mr. Hudson called the Committee into Executive Session and the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting is scheduled for April 17, 2012 at 8:30 a.m., at the Hattie Mae White Educational Support Center, 4400 W. 18th Street.

10. The general meeting adjourned at approximately 10:20 A.M.

Executive Summary: Transforming Schools Brick By Brick

April 2012

Major facility upgrades are happening at schools across the city thanks to the \$805 million bond proposal that voters approved in 2007.

Background/History:

- The 2007 Bond program was structured to be funded from various funding sources, in addition to bond funds, that would not be available for several years.
- The bond program was broken out into four major grouping/phases of projects, based on priority needs that would proceed once funding became available for each group/phase.
- Voters approved the 2007 Bond Program in Nov. 2007. The work includes new schools (primarily elementary schools), safety/security improvements and various other district-wide renovations, additions, improvements and upgrades.
- Litigation delayed the start of the bond program for several months.
- Projects have been proceeding as funds became available. The District secured the funding for the entire 2007 Bond Program earlier this year (2012).
- The last group/phase of projects (Group 4) will be under design this year now that all funding is available.

HISD made many commitments to the public in 2007, and those commitments are being fulfilled.

Pledges HISD made to taxpayers in 2007 included:

1. Initiate a district-wide effort to upgrade campus safety and security

What's been done:

- New fencing installed at 92 schools
- More than 8,700 additional campus security cameras installed

2. Build 13 new schools to replace aging facilities

What's been done:

- Twelve of those schools (*Almeda, Berry, Cunningham, DeChaumes, Frost, Gregg, Herod, Horn, Lovett, Roosevelt, Patterson, and Piney Point Elementary Schools*) are open and serving our students.
- One of those schools (Carnegie Vanguard High School) is under construction and will open later this year.

3. Build 3 new schools to relieve crowding

What's been done:

- DeAnda Elementary School is open and serving our students.
- Two of those schools (Billy Reagan K-8 School, Neff/White Elementary) are under construction

4. Replace outdated schools with low enrollment with 6 new schools

What's been done:

- Three of those schools (*Allen/Kennedy*, *Lewis and Peck/MacArthur Elementary Schools*) are open and serving our students.
- Two of those schools (Atherton Elementary School and Scott/Dogan) are under construction.
- One of those schools (Sherman/Crawford Elementary School) will begin construction in Summer 2012.

5. Expand 2 schools to relieve crowding

What's been done:

 Those two projects (Crockett and Valley West Elementary Schools) are open and serving our students.

6. Build 2 new early college high school (ECHS) facilities and renovate a third one:

What's been done:

- Renovation has been completed at one facility (Central Early College High School)
- Planning/programming is well underway for two new facilities (*North ECHS and South ECHS*).

7. More than 134 school renovation/repair projects

What's been done:

- Projects have been completed at 62 schools and construction is ongoing at more than 47 other schools throughout the city. This work includes:
 - Roof replacements/repairs
 - Heating/ventilation and air-conditioning improvements
 - o Americans with Disabilities Act related improvements
 - o Lighting, electrical, and plumbing improvements
 - Door/window improvements
 - o Restroom upgrades
 - o Science laboratory upgrades

Note: Completed project means that the project is substantially complete and the school is open and serving students. The contractor may be performing and or addressing punch list items and/or warranty related matters.

Exceeding Expectations

More than 50 schools have or will receive renovations, repairs, expansions and/or additional improvements beyond what was originally planned for in the 2007 Bond—all made possible from Trustee allocations and other program realignments.

Introduction Finance Report

HISD 2007 Facilities Capital Program (FCP) continues to move forward with successful momentum. The current overall financial status report for the 2007 Facilities Capital Program comprised of total funding of \$1,176,130,677, actual committed of \$778,116,097 (include encumbrances of \$140,462,356 and actual expenditures of \$637,653,741). This results in an unspent funding to date balance of \$398,014,580.

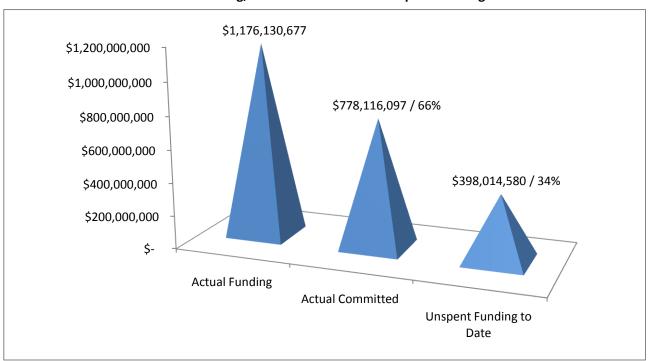
Financial results for the third quarter reflect an increase in actual commitments of \$45,093,071 or 6.15% over the second quarter.

The table below provides the school construction projects spending by funding source and outlines the actual funding, actual committed (include encumbrances and actual expenditures), and unspent funding to date from inception through March 31, 2012. The following chart depicts total actual, committed and unspent funding to date for the same period.

For the period ending March 31, 2012 all projects are currently within budget and on schedule, with exceptions as noted in the Traffic Light Report.

In summary, the March financial report reflects that the FCP has actual commitments of \$778,116,097 on new school construction and renovations projects, of which \$545,931,332 or (70%) was funded by the Rebuild 2007 Bond Issue.
